HHC - Outpatient Clinical Services/GOSH	\$957,881.46	\$957,881.46	Hopewell provides a full continuum of outpatient mental health and MH/substance abuse treatment services for ages from young children to the geriatric population. Services are available in all three counties and include counseling, case management, peer support, and psychiatric care. Sliding fee, based on federal poverty guidelines, is available. Board funds are used for individuals who do not have coverage and may need financial support beyond sliding fee for out-of-pocket costs.	☑	675	AHV
HHC - Blue Line/430/Pontalba	\$74,160.00	\$74,160.00	Located in Athens County, Blue Line Drive and West Union Apartments offer permanent supportive housing for community members who, despite their desire for stable housing, have found that standard housing options have not provided the necessary support they need to manage their complex mental health conditions. Residents live independently with their own leases while accessing on-site, individualized services from Hopewell staff. Board funds cover non-billable support services for residents.	☑	22	AHV
HHC - 24 Hour Crisis	\$698,627.00	\$275,000.00	Crisis intervention services are available face-to-face or by telehealth (as appropriate) 24/7. Crisis Intervention Team staff evaluate individuals in psychiatric crisis and link to appropriate services (e.g., hospitalization, crisis residential, CPST or outpatient counseling.). Services are available at Hopewell behavioral health clinics in all three counties during office hours, via mobile crisis in Athens during office hours and 24/7 at local Emergency Rooms, the jail or the 988-crisis line.	☑	1000	AHV



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HHC - Adam & Amanda	\$1,236,146.00	\$420,000.00	Located in Athens, this is a 16-bed facility with two options. A short-term crisis stabilization unit is available for those who need greater support following a mental health crisis. Individuals stay voluntarily for 3-14 days and are linked to follow-up services. The mental health rehabilitation unit is a step-down program following hospitalization that provides participants with additional time and services to stabilize their care and become stronger before returning to their communities.	☑	209	AHV
HHC - Connett Road Group Home	\$484,385.00	\$17,900.00	Located in The Plains, Connett Road is a mental health group home. This is a licensed, community-based residential setting for adults needing daily support, but not 24/7 hospital care. It offers a safe, home-like environment with trained staff assisting with medication management, daily living skills, and care coordination to help individuals live independently. Board funds assist with operational and staff expenses.	☑	6	AHV
HHC - School-Based Services	\$20,000.00	\$7,000.00	Hopewell has partnerships with school districts in all three counties that includes on-site behavioral health case managers and therapists. Board funds support non-billable non-crisis services to school staff and students such as assisting with development of trauma-informed policies/procedures, implement evidence-based mental health programs (such as Signs of Suicide) and to be a resource in planning on individual student challenges.	☑	1000	AHV

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HHC - Community Medication	\$22,000.00	\$22,000.00	Available in all three counties, this program provides access to psychiatric medications for individuals with severe mental disabilities who are at risk of hospitalization. The program serves eligible, low-income residents who have no coverage or who have a high insurance co-pay with the goal of reducing potential disruptions in care.	☒	18	AHV
HHC - Jail Liaison	\$62,451.00	\$30,500.00	This is a Hopewell staff person who provides on-site services to Individuals with a mental health diagnosis who are in jail to ensure their mental health needs are addressed through effective care coordination while in jail and during the discharge planning process.	☒	120	AHV
HHC - Inpatient After Care	\$97,295.00	\$63,001.00	Returning to daily life after an acute psychiatric hospital stay can be overwhelming. The Inpatient After Care position provides an extra level of care to help individuals navigate hospital discharge, coordinate follow-up appointments, and successfully transition back to the community. Board funds support the position to ensure the service is accessible to anyone in the three county area following discharge from psychiatric hospitalization.	☒	400	AHV



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HHC - Assisted Outpatient Treatment	\$2,722.00	\$2,722.00	The Assisted Outpatient Treatment (AOT) program is a partnership with the Athens County Probate Court to implement a civil legal process that mandates community-based mental health treatment for individuals with severe mental illness who struggle to engage with care voluntarily. The goal is to help individuals stabilize in the community rather than requiring involuntary inpatient hospitalization. Board funds are used to support staff time for the program.	☑	6	A
HHC - Payeeship	\$98,774.00	\$80,796.00	The Payeeship Program supports adults with mental illness in managing their finances. Staff collaborate with clients to prioritize their essential expenses—like rent, food, and medication—to stabilize housing, prevent exploitation, and reduce hospitalizations. The program is available in all three counties with board funds used to provide staff time to work with clients who are a part of the program.	☑	58	AHV
HHC - Housing Loans and Wraparound Services	\$8,336.00	\$8,336.00	The Housing Loans and Wraparound Services provide crucial, stabilizing support for individuals with severe mental illness who are facing imminent housing loss. Eligible residents in Athens, Hocking, and Vinton counties can access targeted resources, including one-time startup housing loans, deposit assistance, and essential wraparound supports to maintain long-term, stable housing.	☑	52	AHV



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HHC - Our House Recovery Residence	\$152,000.00	\$18,000.00	Operated in partnership with Hopewell Health Centers and the Hocking Metropolitan Housing Authority, Our House is a 5-bed recovery residence for men in downtown Logan. Requiring at least 30 days of sobriety to qualify, it provides a safe, drug-free living environment, peer support, and basic case management. Counseling services are available through local community agencies.	☑	11	AHV
HRS - Prevention	\$327,414.00	\$108,278.00	HRS prevention serves youth and adults through education, skill-building, and community partnerships to reduce risk behaviors. Services include classroom and community sessions with family involvement. Frequency varies by program and setting. Board funds support staffing, materials, and program delivery. Outcomes are measured through pre/post assessments of knowledge, attitudes, and behaviors, promoting healthier choices and safer communities.	☑	11996	AHV
HRS - Detox/Residential	\$20,000.00	\$20,000.00	HRS provides detox and residential services to adults and high-need populations in Athens, Hocking, and Vinton counties. Screening and assessments determine level of care. Detox includes medical monitoring; residential offers 24/7 structured care. Frequency is based on clinical need. Board funds support access, staffing, and treatment services not covered by Medicaid. Outcomes include stabilization, reduced overdose risk, and improved long-term recovery.	☑	25	AHV



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HRS - Criminal Justice	\$66,168.00	\$27,291.00	HRS partners with Athens-area courts to provide MAT (Vivitrol, methadone, buprenorphine, injectables) as an alternative to prosecution for justice-involved adults. Services include counseling, case management, and prosecutor coordination. Frequency varies by client need and medication. Board funds support treatment access and services not covered by Medicaid. Outcomes include reduced justice involvement and improved recovery stability.	☑	44	AHV
HRS - MAT	\$1,665,372.00	\$215,372.00	HRS provides MAT services to adults, pregnant women, and special populations in Athens, Hocking, and Vinton counties. Treatment combines medications (methadone, buprenorphine, injectables, Vivitrol) with counseling and supports. Frequency varies by client need and medication. Board funds support medication, staffing, and access to care that is not covered by Medicaid. Outcomes include reduced substance use, improved stability, and long-term recovery, measured by retention, engagement, and treatment progress.	☑	266	AHV



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HRS - Outpatient Treatment	\$435,631.99	\$400,631.99	HRS provides outpatient and community-based services to children, adults, seniors, and high-need populations in Athens, Hocking, and Vinton counties. Services include counseling, MAT, case management, and prevention. Frequency varies by client need. Board funds support staffing and service access that is not covered by Medicaid. Using evidence-based, person-centered care, outcomes include improved stability, functioning, and recovery, measured by engagement, progress, and service outcomes.	☑	100	AHV
HRS - MH Prevention EAGER	\$82,000.00	\$60,000.00	EAGER is a school-based prevention program serving all Hocking County elementary students (K-4). Delivered through semester-long small group sessions, it builds self-esteem, emotional awareness, empathy, decision-making, and coping skills. Board funds support program delivery and staff. Outcomes include improved social skills, communication, and reduced risk behaviors, measured through participation, skill development, and behavioral observations.	☑	150	H
